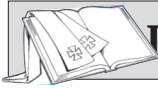

Did You Know?

On Sunday, April 04, 1954, Pastor of Mary, Queen of Peace, Father Anthony McLoughlin, and parish members, witnessed as Msgr. Henry F. Dugan, Archdiocesan Chancellor, presided as he laid the cornerstone for the new church. On August 15, 1954, Archbishop Paul C. Schulte blessed the new church located at Mackey Rd. and U.S. 36. F.A. Wilhelm, Inc. designed a 100' by 60' red brick, one-story building which would hold classrooms on top, but these were never added. Fr. "Tony" left the parish after a decade of service. He was replaced in 1956 by Fr. Edward McLaughlin, Father "Mac".

+ “The Lord will be passing by.” These words spoken by the Lord God to Elijah, are meant for us as we gather in this holy place for the celebration of the Holy Mass.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that God constantly desires us. It is truly awe-inspiring to think that God is always lingering near, desiring us to turn to Him. God is passing by during each and every moment of our lives; in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health.

At times, we discover or experience the presence of God in moments of intense joy, challenge or even sorrow. Remember that God our Father will be “passing by” here in church today; that He will be “passing by” as you get in the car to go home or to grab a bite to eat; that He will be doing so as you settle into your home for some time of leisure.

Of course, it goes without saying that our God remains always with us in the Blessed Sacrament. He awaits us; He invites us, He calls to us. Come, still your hearts and listen!

We pray today to always welcome this “still small whisper” of the Holy Trinity into our hearts, minds and souls as we reflect on the words of Jesus in today’s Gospel: “Take courage, it is I, do not be afraid!”

A reminder to one and all that we will be celebrating the Holy Day of Obligation of the Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary this Thursday and Friday! Mass will be offered on Thursday, August 14th at 7:00 pm and on Friday, August 15th at 8:30 am.

We joyously proclaim the truth that Mary, after her earthly life, was taken up to heaven, body and soul! Our belief in Mary’s Assumption into heaven flows directly from two important dogmas of the Church. First, that the Blessed Mother is Theotokas...the “God-Bearer,” the Mother of God. Second, that from the first instant of her Immaculate Conception, her sinlessness, her virginity and her participation in God’s plan of salvation was complete.

Because of the central place Mary has in our Father’s plan of salvation history, her body did not undergo the corruption due to original sin. Mary’s blessed Assumption offers us a glimpse of the promises made to us when we were baptized into Jesus Christ and His holy Church. We are given the promise that we, too, will enter heaven, where we will find our soul reunited with a glorified body when Christ Jesus returns at the end of all time. What a cause for joy and rejoicing!

Youth Group

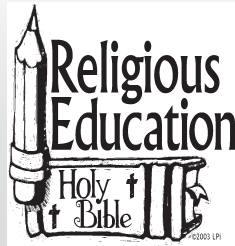
