Did You Know?

A permanent parish was established with Mary, Queen of Peace's first resident pastor, Father Anthony McLoughlin in 1946. The Archdiocese of Indianapolis purchased the Allen Campbell property shortly after the devastating Good Friday tornado in 1948.

Parish members helped remove debris and the rebuilding of the former mortuary began with parish member, Kenneth Smith as contractor. Archbishop Paul Schulte officiated at the dedication Mass on February 13, 1949. Nearly 500 attended a reception that afternoon.

We come to Holy Mass to be fed because whether or not we recognize it, we are hungry. We hunger for spiritual nourishment and strength. We hunger for truth and clarity which only Jesus Christ can give us through His word and His Sacrament!

This nourishment; the very love of the Incarnate Word of God, Jesus Christ, is made present in the Holy Eucharist at each Holy Mass and remains in our midst in the Blessed Sacrament. Always inviting, always compassionate, always awaiting us, Jesus offers us life! Let us open our hearts and truly believe that nothing will separate us from the love of Christ Jesus! For, we know, that nothing in this world can ever take the place of Jesus Christ and His eternal nourishment!

A few more thoughts on "Humanae Vitae:" "Catholic marriage; exactly like Jesus Christ Himself, is not about scarcity but abundance. It is not about sterility, but rather the fruitfulness which flows from unitive and procreative love. Catholic married love always implies the possibility of new life. This is what the Church means when She teaches that Catholic married love is by its nature both unitive and procreative; not either/or."

On another note, it is my usual practice, upon request, to periodically visit the chronically ill or homebound for Confession and/or Anointing of the Sick. If someone you know requests this, I would be happy to schedule a visit.


