## Did You Know?

Fr. Charles Chesebrough was assigned on November 30, 1983 to our parish. During that time the existing church was built. It was designed by Architect, Kevin Callahan at the cost of \$1,200,000 and seated 400 parishioners. It was dedicated by Archbishop O'Meara in 1990. Fr. Charlie was transferred to St. Charles Borromeo in Bloomington on April 26, 1995. Fr. Vincent Lampert arrived to his first pastorate on April 26, 1995. Fr. Vince was also director of the Office of Pro-Life Activities. He worked with volunteers to "spruce up" the Rectory and the Religious Edu-

cation Building. He enabled many new groups to serve others until he was transferred to St. Therese of the Infant Jesus in Indianapolis on September 9, 1998.
