Did You Know?

Cardinal Joseph E. Ritter was born in New Albany, IN and studied for the priesthood at St. Meinrad. On March 28,1933 he was consecrated as Auxiliary Bishop of Indianapolis and then installed as the 7th Bishop of Indianapolis



apolis. On March 5,1939, he established Mary Queen of Peace as a Mission Church. On December 19, 1944, he became the youngest in America to be elevated to an Archbishop. In 1945, he came to Mary, Queen of Peace to confirm the class. On October 8, 1946, he was enthroned as the Archbishop of St. Louis. On December 14,1960, Pope John XXIII nominated him as Cardinal and his red hat was bestowed on him on January 1, 1961. Cardinal Ritter High School, on West 30th St. in Indianapolis, was founded in 1964 in his honor. At this time, Cardinal Joseph Elmer Ritter is the ONLY Cardinal from Indiana.

+ Dear Friends.

These several Sundays of parables reach their conclusion this weekend as Jesus teaches three final lessons about the kingdom of heaven. The first two, the parables of the treasure and the pearl, point to the inestimable value of the kingdom. And, by extension, our Catholic Faith.

The third, about the fish and nets, is similar to last weekend's parable about the weeds in the field. It focuses our attention on the separation of the good from the evil at the end of time. Jesus' question to His disciples...."Do you understand all these things?" is directed to US as well.

The goal of our Lord in preaching the parables has been to bring us closer to the very nearness and presence of His kingdom. That kingdom is not something up in the sky or down the road for which we idly wait.

In the sacrament of baptism, we are called to be active builders of His kingdom. As people drawn together and united by the Holy Eucharist, we are called to bring His Eucharistic presence to our world, in order to give the world a glimpse of the fullness of that kingdom that is to come!

Now, for Pope Paul IV's second "reason" for "Humanae Vitae." The Holy Father warned that artificial contraception might be marketed as "liberating" for women but the real "beneficiaries" would be men. "Many have attacked the Catholic Church for Her alleged disregard of women, but the Church in "Humanae Vitae" identified and rejected sexual exploitation of women years before that message entered the cultural mainstream." Again, Paul IV has been proven correct.

Thirdly, Paul IV warned that the massive export of artificial contraceptives, abortion and sterilization by the developed to developing nations "frequently as a prerequisite for aid dollars is a thinly disguised form of population warfare. Sound familiar?

Fourth, the Holy Father warned that artificial contraception would mislead humanity into thinking we have unlimited control over our own bodies. IF procreation can be misrepresented as an "infection" to be attacked, "so too can new life."

Our society has become wracked with a "coarsening of attitudes toward the sanctity of human life." It is so obvious that we have a serious evil among us. It is literally killing people. "Humanae Vitae" is filled with truth. It is therefore a key to our freedom."

A bit more next week. Have a "prayer-full" week, everyone!
