1 Thessalonians 2:4, 3

"For My thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways My ways, says the Lord."

It is close to impossible for us to grasp the depths of God's mercy and generosity isn't it? We need look no further than the parable in today's Gospel for an example.
