What a joy it is for us to continue our "Eucharistic Journey" through St. John's sixth chapter of the Holy Gospel!



Save the Date - Saturday, September 26 - and Save the Time, 9:00 a.m. to noon. Why? To give the Gift of Life. The Knights of Columbus is


