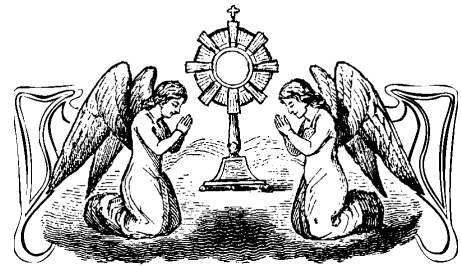
CHRIST IS RISEN; INDEED, HE HAS RISEN!!

Young Messiah

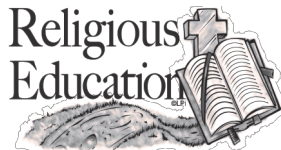
