A CELEBRATION TOO GOOD TO MISS!!



Mark your calendar now to join us for the annual Divine Mercy Sunday Celebration on APRIL 23rd at 2:30 p.m. This is the Sunday after Easter.

The Feast of Divine Mercy was instituted by Pope Saint John Paul II, in response to a specific request made by Jesus Himself in the 1930's to His Messenger of Divine Mercy, Saint Faustina. Join us for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Veneration of the Divine Mercy Image, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, a Eucharistic Procession and Benediction!
