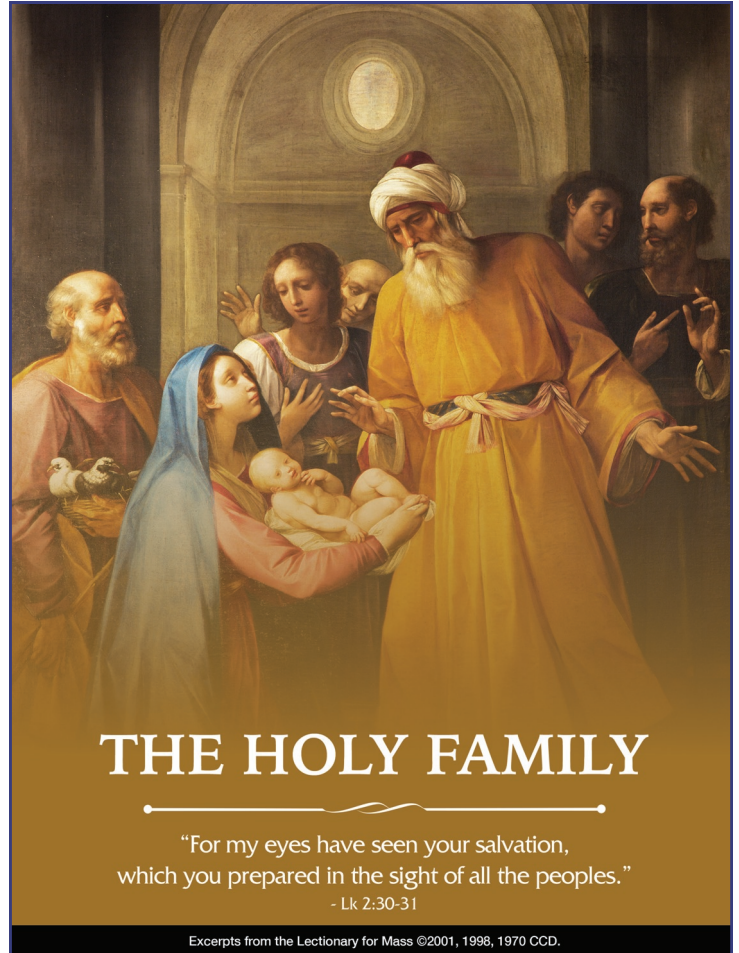

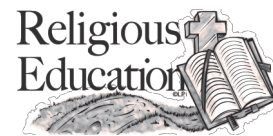
Incense Usage at Mass
