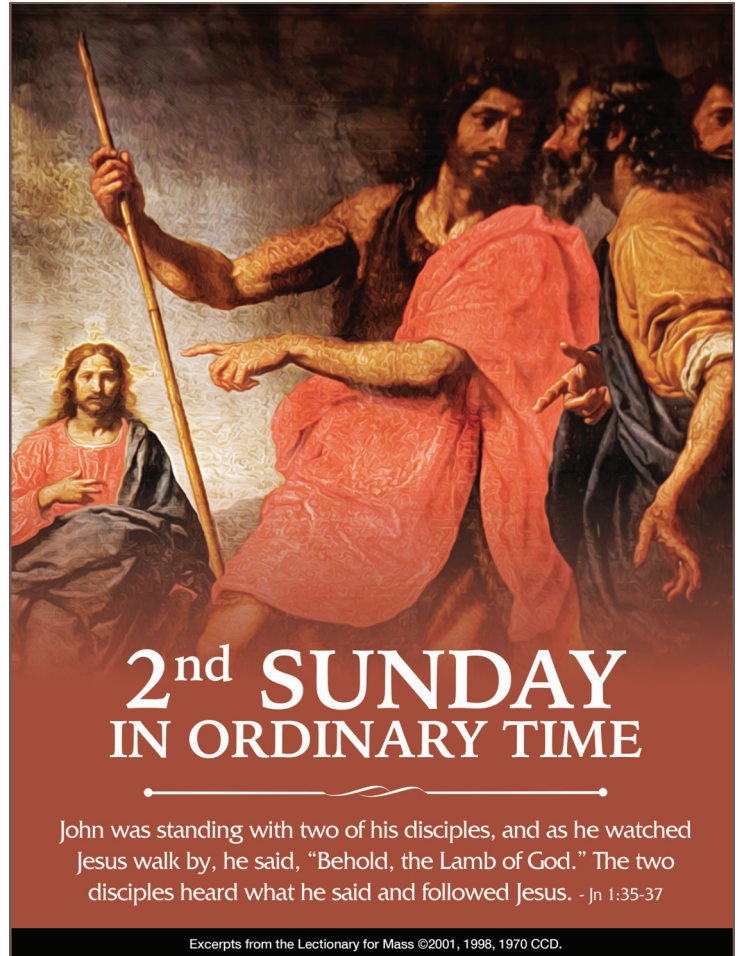

+Dear Friends,

"Here am I, Lord; I come to do Your will."
This refrain from today's responsorial psalm is a beautiful prayer for all believers as this brief bit of Ordinary Time opens before us.

Today, as baptized and practicing Catholics, how fitting that we hear the call of the prophet Samuel, who is told by Eli to *respond* to the Lord's call with the words: "Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening." We also hear today the Lord Jesus call the Apostles to follow Him. It's as if the Liturgy of the Word is speaking directly to *us*...and, your know what? It is!

In the same manner, through His holy word, the Lord Jesus calls each and every one of us into service for the sake of His Kingdom. As we often hear, whether or not that is as dedicated, faithful married folk, a chaste single life, or as priests or religious, *each one of us has been called by Christ!*

There is an age-old axiom in the Church universal: "how we pray shows how we believe," and it rings as true today as it ever has. I truly believe that more and more Catholics throughout the world are coming to a deeper and clearer understanding of both *What and Who* the Mass is! The more we believe that, as a recent convert to the Catholic Faith put it so very well, "when we enter the doors of the church, it becomes all about HIM; not me; not about my desires, likes or dislikes," then we are grasping the true meaning of the Mass. Remember, we are all still learning!

It may be difficult to believe....but Ash Wednesday, February 14th, is only FOUR weeks away! We should have just left the purple décor in place from Advent! I don't know; but for some reason, I like the start of Lent, it means winter is passing, days are growing longer and the Lenten Season represents the coming glory of Easter. I may be off a day or two, but it's something like 71 days till Spring! But, I like the snow, I know,

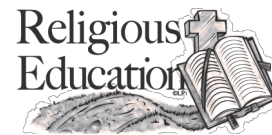
I'm daft. It's the darkness I don't like.
