May Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament, bless them all! May they always receive Jesus with the same wonder and awe with which they do this day.

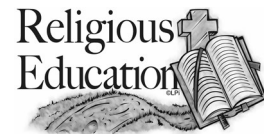
