+Dear Friends,

In today's Gospel, our Lord sends His Apostles out on a mission. This mission is one in which all of us who are baptized are called to participate on a daily basis.

While we may not all be called to drive out demons (although we may think we know a few) or anoint with oil and cure people, we are still called to share the truth of Jesus Christ.

When you think about it, there really are a variety of ways one can "cure" another person. Sometimes all it takes is a smile and a nod of the head or an inquiry as to how the other person is feeling. Showing basic Christian kindness and respect goes a long way in offering someone the needed light they may need.

At times Catholics are a little hesitant about sharing the faith with another person. We don't want to come across as pushy or "judgmental." But, it is precisely in sharing the beauty and mystery of the Catholic faith that we follow the command of Jesus and go out and bring others to Him and to His Church. The days of Catholics being somehow timid or even seemingly ashamed of being Catholic are past! For those of us old enough to remember Confirmation in the "old days," we were taught by the sisters that we would now become "Soldiers of Christ." That image and truism always has stayed with me.

St. Paul tells us to proclaim Christ "in season and out of season." On the surface that seems sort of an odd thing to say doesn't it? He is actually telling us that there is *no* time in which we are not to proclaim with conviction and compassion, the invitation of Jesus to "Come, follow Me."

As you all go about your lives in the marketplaces of our world, remember, you take Christ with you! Your Catholic faith is a part of you, which all should know and see. Remember, little things mean a lot. You may never know what a word or gesture on your part did for another's journey of faith!

Elementary RE:

When we hurt somebody it is necessary to apologize to restore our friendship, right? The same is true of our friendship with God - when we hurt our friendship by our sins, we need to say we are sorry and receive his restoring forgiveness. If any families want a guide for an examination of conscience for teens or children, contact Matthew in the RE office.

Registration packets for elementary religious education class 2018-19 are available now, at the top of the stairs. They may be returned there, delivered/mailed to the office, or added to the collection plate at Mass.

<u>Catechists with children:</u> Please take an envelope labeled for catechists to get your discounted price.

We still need <u>four more</u> people to share their faith to our kids as catechists. Our classes begin on August 19th! Right now we have a veteran returning in all our classes, so you would not be on your own.

<u>Parents</u>: Is your child older than third grade, but has not yet received some/any sacraments? The parish RE program will be offering special classes modeled on the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) to prepare them to receive the needed sacraments of initiation at the Easter vigil on April 20th. Talk with Matthew about joining the group.

Adult RE:

Habitat for Humanity is starting a building project this September in Clayton, and MQP is going to volunteer some physical labor (10-15 workers) one day this September or October! No prior experience or training is required. Add your name to the sheet on the bulletin board at the top of the stairs to indicate your interest.

In the meantime, you can meet the future homeowner at a breakfast to start the project. It will be held on the morning of July 20 at 7:30 a.m., at the Habitat Re-Store facility - 1099 North State Road 267.

There are two studies to be offered this year, beginning August 19th. We will start with a study of 'The Pivotal Players' -6 people who were instrumental in different ways in building the Catholic Church. After Thanksgiving we will conclude 'The Great Adventure' series with a study on the Acts of the Apostles. Find more information on the RE bulletin board at the top of the stairs. Please sign up to indicate your interest so we may be prepared with materials.


