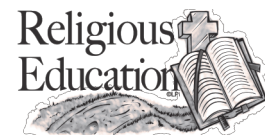
As formerly when the people of Palestine touched the hem of His garments, so upon contact with Christ in the Sacred Host the same great power again goes forth from Him!
