In today's Gospel, our Lord makes the startling revelation: *"I am the Bread of Life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger and whoever believes in Me will never thirst."*

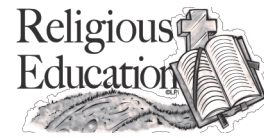

3. The story of Joshua leading the Israelites into the Promised Land includes parting the Jordan River by the power of the Ark of the Covenant. Joshua 3:5-17 and 4:1-18
4. God parted the Jordan River for Elijah before he was taken up in a whirlwind. 2 Kings 2:8.
5. Just after this, God parts the river again for Elisha to return as he came, and confirm him as the successor of Elijah, 2 Kings 2:14.
