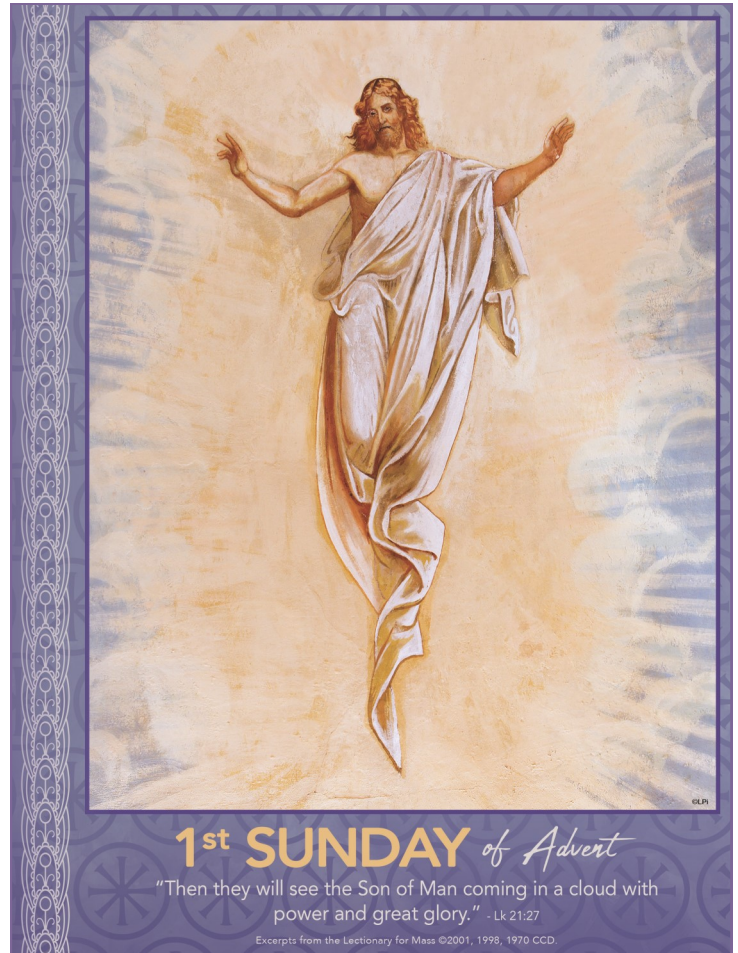

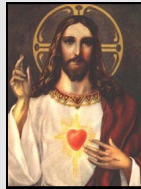

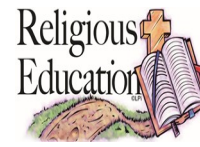

**Every** member of the Church who has begun receiving Holy Communion is expected to celebrate the sacrament of penance and reconciliation at least once per year. The parish penance service on Dec. 12 would fulfill this even more conveniently than a Saturday afternoon. After all, children cannot get to the Church on their own. Young disciples (along with parents) will be the first to form lines to the priest of their choice so that they may get home at a reasonable time on a school night.
