

Lenten Disciplines



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday, which is on April 18.

The very familiar story about Moses and the burning bush reminds us today that our God is shrouded in mystery. (And that's a *good* thing!) As Moses approached the very Presence of God, he removed his sandals...he was on holy ground. Sound familiar? Perhaps we could each reflect and name one way that we have grown closer to Jesus during this season of Lent.

As we continue our Lenten journey, remember that the Stations of the Cross are offered each Friday of Lent beginning at 6:00 p.m!

This Wednesday, March 27, there will be NO CONFES-SIONS FROM 6 TO 7:00 P.M! I must attend the Parish Council Meeting that night. There is a reminder on the front door of the church as well.

Believe it or not, we are now half way through Lent! Next weekend is LAETARE SUNDAY. Remember to wear something ROSE colored to Mass!

Let us continue those good Lenten resolutions!

CRS Rice Bowl: This week of Lent we encounter Christyan Dhathcroos, a farmer in Sri Lanka. When he was 14 his family fled the civil war in his country, and then couldn't return for 16 years. When he did return, he found the farm overgrown and in shambles. He now had a family of his own to support and he needed help to get going. CRS Rice Bowl helped him get seeds and fertilizer, made sure they had access to water, and helped with his children's education. No one in Christyan's family had ever finished their education, but the teacher's in his son Godwin's Catholic school are sure that he will finish and become a scientist as he wishes. Christyan says, "When we had nothing, CRS came and helped us. Now we should help others, too."

Can you do some work or give up some pleasure to donate to the rice bowl this week to help people like Christyan who've been the victims of war rebuild their lives?

<u>Parents</u>: If you would like to pray the Stations of the Cross but cannot attend the Friday communal session, the RE building will be open between the Masses so you can use the prayers and stations posted in the hallway.

Our students will participate in this devotional prayer on Sunday, April 14, in the lower level; all are welcome to join us!
