This week we encounter Ona from Gaza. She had studied hard and earned a teaching degree, but she could not find work. That is why CRS helped match workers with job opportunities. Through CRS, Ona applied for an internship and was hired to teach math. She saved her money and soon opened her own tutoring center. She is a lucky one - Gaza has the highest unemployment rate in the world (41%), and for the past 10 years there has been a blockade of this territory which prevents Gazans from seeking better economic opportunities. Most recently, the U.S. government has blocked all aid money for Gaza - public or private.

Our rice bowl contributions will be used elsewhere for now. We will collect the bowls next week.

Over the past three years since Family Promise was started in Hendricks County, dozens of homeless local families have been helped to find housing and employment. Its success is totally due to both the dedicated people who work with the families at the center and to the people of our parish who volunteer to cook and chaperone the families when they stay at our facilities overnight four times each year. Recently, Family Promise moved into their new facilities in Plainfield where they can expand their services to include legal help and referrals, in addition to helping families find housing and employment.
