

+Dear Friends,

My remarks today are rather short. You need a break once in awhile don't you?!

Today we hear the very familiar parable of the Good Samaritan. It's meant to teach us what it means to be a follower of our Lord Jesus. We are called to respond with mercy to the needs of others. This really includes all types of people; those we know and those we don't know. Those we love and those we may find difficult to love.

What seems like a nice little story (in some parts!) is actually quite radical. How so? Well, remember in the day of Jesus, "one's neighbor" included family and clan and that was about it. Even then, if someone somehow shamed the family or tribe, they themselves were shunned or cast out. It was inconceivable to "love" someone outside the circle of known family and tribe.

We name this Gospel passage after the Good Samaritan because he is clearly the parable's "hero." I think we can identify him as a symbol of our Lord, or see him as a model of what any follower of Jesus should be as well. But let's think also of the poor guy left for dead in the ditch along the road.

When he saw the Samaritan approach, I wonder what his thoughts were? We might think a guy in the situation he was in would accept help from just about anybody, right? But, maybe not. Needing help; acknowledging our weaknesses, our asking assistance, at times isn't easy; we're too proud for that.

Ultimately of course, we need to see both our weaknesses and sins *together with* the compassion and grace offered us by Jesus and His Church. AND, be humble enough to acknowledge our need! So, not only are WE called to be Good Samaritans, but we are also called to admit that sometimes, we are the guy in the ditch!

The scholar of the law, asked Jesus: "And who is my neighbor?" If asked today, do you wonder what Jesus' answer would be? Ponder *your* answer to this question the implications it entails. Who really is your neighbor?
