+Dear Friends,

This weekend, I have the distinct pleasure of introducing you to my good, good priest friend, Fr. Jim Koressel. Fr. Jim just retired on June 26th and our parish is his very first weekend subbing in a parish! How great is that? He is a wonderful priest and friend and a very good homilist so I am sure and certain you will enjoy having him visit the parish this weekend! Where am I? Well, the Vicar General insisted that I accompany him on a little jaunt so, of course, I dutifully obeyed! Ergo, any complaints go to him!

You know, Abraham’s bartering with God should not prompt us to do the same. Whenever you have heard this story, don’t you always wonder how Abraham had the gall to argue over and over with God? I know, all of us do this in some fashion from time to time but I don’t honestly believe we make it a regular habit!

The moral of the story is to convince us of God’s mercy; not His righteous anger. God had every right to destroy Sodom and Gomorrah. Each time we pray the Confiteor at Mass, we strike our chest three times as we admit our sins of both commission as well as omission. God has every right to “punish” us as well if we’re honest with ourselves.

But, as I said, the true moral is God’s almost unbelievable mercy shown to us every day of our lives. It is simply beyond us; we who like to hold onto the resentment, grudges and our “me first” mentality.

When we pray the “Our Father,” we admit our sins while at the same time, imploring the Father’s forgiveness. I think an important line of the prayer is this: “...forgive us AS WE FORGIVE...” That’s the punch right there. *Only* to the extent that we forgive will we ourselves be forgiven. Sort of makes you stop and think doesn’t it?

We should never forget our Lord’s call: “...ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.” The very best way for us to “ask, seek and knock” is in Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament! Whether or not the Holy Eucharist is exposed in the monstrance or reposed in the tabernacle, prayer before our Eucharistic Lord is the very best prayer, second only to the offering of the Mass that we can offer Jesus Christ. Stop in church and visit He Who waits for YOU! Let us always make an offer to take part in our monthly Adoration on First Thursday/First Friday for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. As the Sacred Heart told St. Margaret Mary: “The more you honor Me, the more I will bless you!” Now *that* is speaking to God!

This also brings up something I would like to offer to you for reflection. I feel it is vital to the spiritual life of our parish. Perhaps you read in *The Criterion* a couple weeks back, that my good friend, Fr. Mike Keucher, pastor of St. Joseph’s in Shelbyville, with his parishioners, opened the latest Perpetual Adoration Chapel in the Archdiocese. What a joy!

His parish has about 200 more families than we do. All

time slots are more than covered to offer twenty-four hour, seven days a week, Adoration of our Lord! The parish is so excited to be able to do this. I mention this because here at Mary, Queen of Peace, we are blessed to offer 3 hours of Adoration each Thursday before First Friday of most months. You will recall that each year on the weekend of Corpus Christi, the bulletin contains a sign-up sheet for everyone to sign up for just a half-hour of Adoration each month. I would like for you to guess how many sign-ups we received back in the collection or at the office....NONE. Not one single new parishioner signed up for a half hour of Adoration. I realize some folks simply choose to stop by for prayer without formally signing up. However, the response speaks poignantly about the spiritual life of our parish. Of everything we do as a parish, devotion to Jesus in the Holy Eucharist must be number one! Nothing we do; nothing we attempt has true meaning without such devotion.

Why the lack of response? I honestly do not know. We shall continue with the faithful few; praying for more to join. But, every member of our great parish needs to personally and prayerfully reflect upon this. Such reflection will greatly benefit our parish. Pray about it my friends.
