CRS Boosts Vanilla Growing in Uganda

Uganda's vanilla quality is so high that people around the world refer to it as 'Green Gold' because of rising demand. It is a very volatile crop to grow as prices go up and down. The government has taken an important step to make the nation into a global leader in vanilla production by limiting the amount of time that the crop may be harvested. The scramble for the crop had resulted in premature harvesting, frequent instances of theft, even killings of farmers. By stopping the sale of vanilla when it is too early, the overall quality of the marketplace will rise. This will enable small shareholder farmers to get a fair price, while ensuring that global buyers, like the U.S., are getting the highest quality beans. Besides working with the Ugandan government on creating the regulatory framework, CRS is working with vanilla and coffee farmers on crop diversification and other farming techniques to help build their resilience to price volatility.
