

I knew the time would come for me to write something along the following lines but I guess one never knows when it may come about. I want to thank all of you for your wonderful words of caring, sympathy and prayers as I and the family grieve the loss of my great Mom, Rita, or Miss Rita, as she was called. You all never had the opportunity to meet and get to know Mom over my time here due to her failing health these past five years. You would have loved her: a sparkling, funny sense of wit and humor, her German sense of "if you're going to do something, do it the best you can," and her sense of style. She always had to look her best, even around the house and was dusting things till the day before she passed away! For all of my priesthood and most especially after Dad died sixteen years ago, I tried my best to be home for her every Sunday afternoon until Tuesday morning. Believe me, she let me know that she was not pleased whenever I couldn't make it! I was with her since I found her on the floor beside her bed until she took her last breath and one tear rolled down her cheek.

When a priest loses his last parent, especially his Mom, he feels like an orphan; home is no more. I asked her later that night "Mom, what am I going to do on Sundays now?" I know friends and priest brothers will be there for me but the thought remains. Please keep Mom, my family and myself in your prayers. And, bear with me; it's going to take me awhile. And, thanks again.
