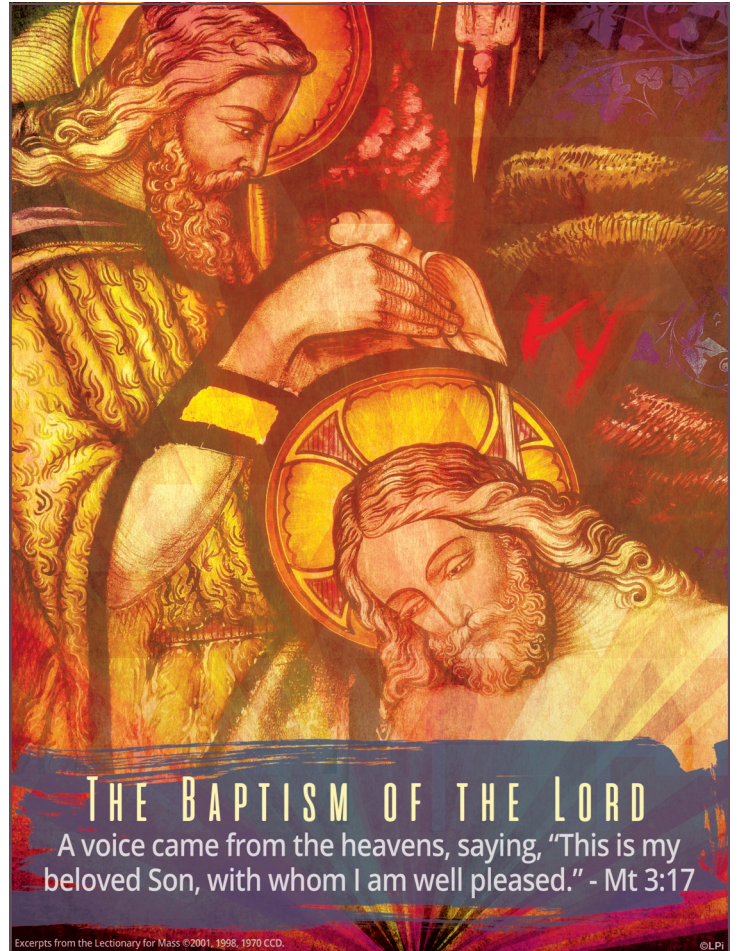

+Dear Friends,

Today Holy Mother Church concludes the Christmas Season with the celebration of **THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD JESUS CHRIST**. How fitting it is that the refrain for the responsorial psalm is "The Lord will bless His people with peace."

As we celebrate the continued manifestation of Jesus to the world, we recognize the awesome potential for peace that exists in the hearts of all who have been baptized into Christ and His Holy Church.

Isaiah tells us that God's chosen ones are those who follow this belief: "A bruised reed he shall not break, and a smoldering wick he shall not quench." What's that all about? Well, quite simply it means that Jesus, and by extension His Church and you and I are called to encourage others to the compassion and truth that exists only in Jesus Christ. It means that the wounded are to be welcomed and brought the good news that healing and reconciliation is made manifest through Jesus and those who follow Him. It means that we are witnesses to this and are quite ready, willing and able to invite others into the fullness of the Church.

The celebration of Jesus' Baptism is an occasion for us to contemplate our own baptism and the responsibilities that came with it. Let us pray that we may be up to the challenge and the privilege! Thanks to the Baptism of the Lord Jesus Christ, never again must we confront the horror of our sins alone!

On a very practical consideration of our baptism, allow me to mention just a few things. First, after being a priest for almost thirty-five years, it is never a good sign when the grandparents make the call inquiring about baptism for a grandchild in place of the parents themselves. Of course, if the parents are from out of town, it is understandable. However, as a general rule, the *parents* need to be inquiring about the baptism of their child(ren). Secondly, the priest or deacon who will be minister of the Sacrament, *must have assurance* that the child will not only be baptized but "*raised in the practice of the faith*." In other words, once baptized, the child must be brought to Mass and raised in the Church. It is so sad when a child is presented for his or her First Holy Communion and they or their parents haven't darkened the door of the church since his or her baptism...truly sad. As you have heard me say more than once, the Sacraments are NOT magic; they do not convey grace in a vacuum. They are not some nice thing to do; they MUST be lived! If the priest or deacon has no solid assurance that the child will be raised in the practice of the Faith, he cannot provide the Sacrament. Our Faith is a joyful AND serious gift my friends. Let us never take them for granted!

God's blessings be upon you this week! Let us continue to pray for one another!
