Ring the doorbell. Donation drop-off times: weekdays from 8 a.m.-4 p.m. or weekends from 9 a.m.-4 p.m.) Here's a list of items that they are in need of:

IMMEDIATE NEEDS: Thin maxi pads, manual can openers, baby wipes; fabric softener/sheets; antibacterial cleaning wipes; general kitchen cleaners; shampoo & conditioner; toilet paper; paper towels; tissues; postage stamps; laundry detergent; paper bowls; toilet cleanser; nonperishable food items – cereal, mac 'n' cheese, peanut butter, jelly, canned pastas, canned fruit, soup; ethnic hair care products; \$10 gas cards (Speedway Gas Only cards are great); bottled water; plastic spoons, forks and knives.

WISH LIST: Laundry detergent, fabric softener/ sheets, toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, paper plates, paper bowls, baby wipes, antibacterial cleaning wipes, toilet cleanser, plastic spoons, forks, & knives, nonperishable food items – cereal, mac 'n' cheese, peanut butter, jelly, canned pastas, canned fruit, soup, feminine products, shampoo, conditioner, ethnic hair care products, body wash, lotion, deodorant, razors, shaving cream, bath towels & washcloths, gas cards, stamps, underwear (for adults and children – new), bras – all sizes (gently used is fine), bottled water, coffee and creamer/sugar, snack foods/cereal/fruit, milk and juice, trash bags (39-gallon & 13-gallon bags).
