This week's Gospel is a "tough love" experience. Jesus puts it right on the line. "Pick up your cross and follow Me." No whenever you want to. No when it's convenient and you don't have anything better to do. No when you're on vacation or have some sort of activity that you simply can't miss. In my homily you heard me talk about 'cheap religion'; easy, convenient, no challenging of our consciences. Of false shepherds, who cave to society and culture, so folks won't leave the parish or church. If that's what a person wants, fine, go find it and see how long it lasts. Go, see if it gains you eternal life. You know what? It won't. Oh, this type of faith-life may be less demanding in this world but that's about where it will end; in this world. Our Lord's words are pretty darn clear; especially today's Gospel. Remember, they are HIS words, not man's.

After a couple weeks' experience, I hope everyone has adjusted to the adjustments for gaining entrance and exiting the church! With also moving the confessional into the small vestibule, things are certainly different, right? All good things come at a price; we need to remember that. I think it is exciting to see things being prepared and all the goings-on of new construction! Just think, it's been thirty years since our parish built anything new, so this is a sign of growth and wisdom for the future life of St. Mary's.

After consultation with Archbishop Charles and meeting with Fr. Bill from St. Augustine Episcopal Church here in town, any funerals which may arise in our parish, outside ones involving cremation, will be held there. It's a pretty little church and beautiful grounds. Naturally things will be different having a funeral Mass there but we are so similar in liturgical architecture that it almost 'feels' like we are in our own church. It's nice working together.

In these weird times, it is SO easy to lose track of time. It doesn't seem possible that next weekend we will be observing and celebrating the Fourth of July! It doesn't mean this any longer

given the changes schools have made, but in my day we always felt a certain sense that "gosh, summer is almost over!" It wasn't, of course; we almost never started until after Labor Day. Man, it still was hot! Annunciation had no AC, nor did Brazil High School. Most of us nearly collapsed but somehow we made it. I always would roll my eyes when the sisters would tell us: "don't fan yourselves; it only makes you hotter!" Right, sister! Of course they were dying also with their full habits. And, they had no AC upstairs in their convent either. Talk about troopers. Funny how looking back on days like that now, mostly brings a smile to our face. We survived. No bike helmets, no seat belts, nothing covering all the outlets in the house, going barefoot almost all summer, even lying in the back window of the car! Our Moms telling us: "go out and play, come in for lunch, then come back in when it gets dark for supper."
