In last week's readings, our Lord Jesus summoned us to develop the trait of humility. This week we are asked to develop the trait of receptivity.

The metaphors used in today's scripture readings remind us that we need to be like the fertile soil, awaiting the rain and nutrients that will enrich that soil.

Without these key necessities, we will not be the fertile soil, nor will we sprout new life and provide nourishment for ourselves and others. Perhaps today, we could ask ourselves two questions. One, how receptive am I to Jesus? Secondly, how can I become even more so in the future? As always, let us pray for one another on our journey of faith!

Isn't it wonderful....we are right in the midst of the season of summer. Sure, we complain about the heat but we also complain about the cold in winter! We like to complain about something!
