Perhaps saying “no” once in awhile to something that I don’t really need in my life is a good thing. 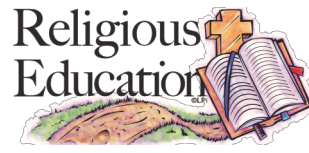

An Update

Thank you to all who have already turned in the registration forms for their child(ren)!

Early registration always helps in planning and preparation. **Those who have not yet turned in registration forms please do so as soon as possible.**

Planning for this school year has been very challenging with Covid-19 to consider and our building under construction. Knowing how many children we will have in each class is crucial to our preparation. **Please put completed registration forms in the box provided on the registration table in the narthex or bring to the parish office.**

We are using a combination of teaching methods. Our Pre-K and Kindergarten students will have lessons prepared by their teacher and sent home to them via a "mailbox" that will be located at the top of the stairway in church. The "mailbox" will be marked with your child's class level and your family name. Parents can pick up the assignments each week or two depending on what the teacher decides to do. Just check your "mailbox" each week after Mass.

We will be using Zoom for children in grades 1-7. Since many households share a family computer it will be necessary to spread the classes over a few hours. Each class will be 30 minutes, so two grade levels would take an hour.

We plan on having grades 5, 6, and 7 on Saturday evening from 6:30-7:00, 7:00-7:30, and 7:30-8:00, respectively. Sunday evening classes would be for grades 1, 2, 3, and 4 and would be held at 5:00-5:30, 5:30-6:00, 6:00-6:30, and 6:30-7:00, respectively.

Each class will meet in person between the Masses from 9:00-10:10 in the lower level of the church on the following days:

- Grades PreK-K-1-2 – Sunday, September 20
- Grades 3-4 – Sunday, September 27
- Grades 5-6-7 – Sunday, October 4
- Grades PreK-K – Sunday, October 25
- Grades 1-2 – Sunday, November 1
- Grades 3-4 – Sunday, November 8
- Grades 5-6-7 – Sunday, November 15
- Grades PreK-K – Sunday, November 22
- Grades 1-2 – Sunday, December 6
- Grades 3-4 – Sunday, December 13

All students will wear masks, hand sanitizer will be available and used, no food or drink will be allowed, social distancing will be followed, and the room will be sanitized before and after classes. All students will be responsible for their own books and pencils or pens. There will be no sharing.

Please keep in mind and prayers that this situation is temporary, and that in-person classes will hopefully resume in January in our beautiful new building!
