

+Dear Friends.

I just received notice from the Archdiocese that the DISPENSATION FROM SUNDAY MASS OB-LIGATION IS NOW TO CONTINUE UNTIL THE SO-LEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS'... NOVEMBER 1, 2020. It means we continue as we are currently operating. Those with underlying health issues, caring for the ill or those over 60, should use good judgment. All others need to also practice faithful judgment. Masks are required.

Our students are returning to school in the various corporations around us. No one knows the future. We need to pray and hope all goes well for all students, teachers and families!

Given my "Parish Letter" which I sent to all of you earlier in this past week, this is somewhat 'old news' but bears repeating. After consultation with both our pastoral council as well as the Archdiocese, I have made the following pastoral decision for the fall term. The continuing uncertainty of the immediate future makes the decision to use Danville High School unreasonable. I do not wish to have our students, catechists and parents placed in the position of even facing the possibility of DHS closing and leaving our children to face an even more uncertain schedule for RE classes. Thus, the optimal path for our parish is Plans B & C, as noted in my general email letter to you all a few weeks back.

Tom Mills of our parish will be setting up an online, 'Zoom' type program for us to utilize. Thus our catechists (excluding Pre-K and Kindergarten), will schedule their classes for a time other than the usual Sunday morning time. Once each month, two grade levels will meet in the church basement for an in-person class with their catechists. Now, I realize with scheduled vacations/ breaks/holidays, this may not always be available but overall it will work.

Parents I have heard from have overwhelmingly (as in only two opposing) opted for the implementation of Plans B & C. Our new RE building will be available for the second semester. I fully realize this is not perfect. However, I believe the deeper involvement of parents in the Catholic

Education of their children and given our unique situation of having no facilities available makes this the best option.

I am asking for everyone's understanding and cooperation. I believe you already realize the concern Lynn, our catechists, and I have for the continuance of the teaching of our Catholic treasure to our youth! Our RE program will begin as soon as Tom has a system up and running. I hope to begin on the originally scheduled date of the Sunday after Labor Day. I will keep everyone fully updated!


