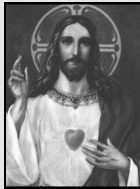

When I saw some folks drive up only to read the notice on the door (I guess not everyone does email after all!), those feelings intensified. I hope that you all found out in time and attended St. Susanna or St. Malachy.

While writing ahead of events, I will take this opportunity to say: “DANKE, SCHOEN!” to everyone who helped with last Friday’s drive through OKTOBERFEST! I hope I am a prophet when I say it was a success. Probably not as much as we hoped but still, it gave the parish a chance to gather a fry and be a part of our larger community as well. A Fish Fry drive through is being planned for next month as well! Remember, all proceeds go to the building fund and operational needs! Collections are way down due to attendance and the Covid.

Missed opportunities. Life seems filled with them. We’ve all had them. Today at Mass we heard another parable. This one concerned the landowner who plants a vineyard. I hope you heard the final line of the parable carefully: “The kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit.”

Sometimes we have to wonder if we realize that we were given the responsibility of building the kingdom of Jesus when we were baptized. Unfortunately, in the days in which we live, deny it or not, overt signs of our Catholic/Christian Faith, are barely tolerated by many people. We need to always remember the prophetic words of Pope-Emeritus Benedict XVI when he was first elected. The Church may be smaller in the future; grand edifices we once built and used may be closed and merged, but the Church will be much more faithful and united in the proclamation of our Catholic Faith. It will be so out of both obedience to the command of Our Lord but also out of necessity.

These are the fruits of the vineyard of the kingdom of Jesus. When we depart from Mass today, let’s not roll through this life missing the opportunities to help build Jesus’ kingdom by our acts of stewardship!

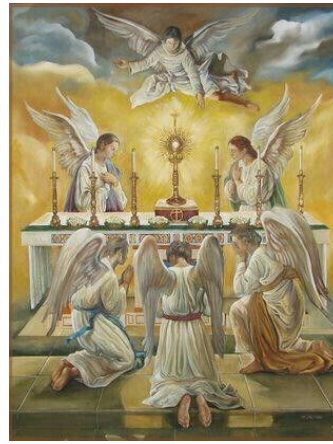
