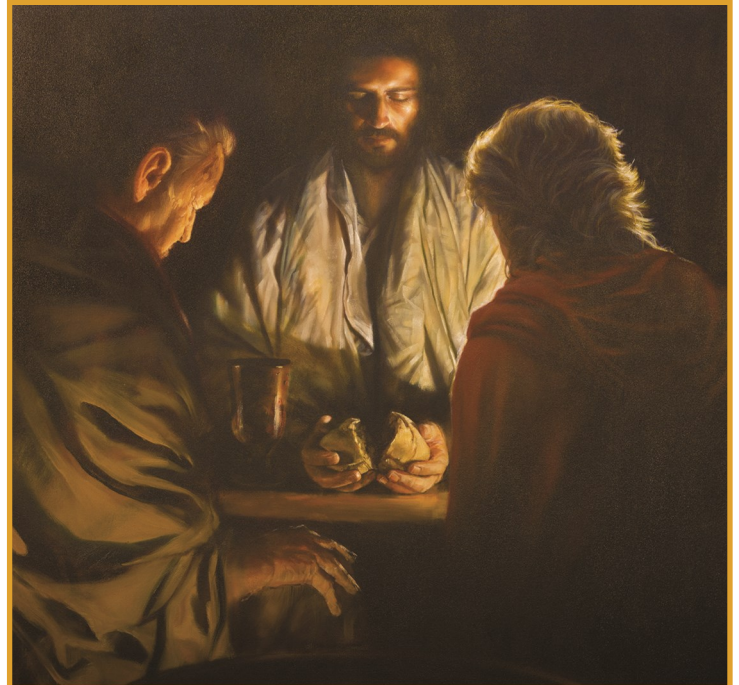

+Dear Friends,

"Here am I, Lord; I come to do Your will." This refrain from today's responsorial psalm is a beautiful prayer for all believers as this brief bit of Ordinary Time opens before us.

Today, as baptized and practicing Catholics, how fitting that we hear the call of the prophet Samuel, who is told by Eli to *respond* to the Lord's call with the words: "Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening." We also hear today the Lord Jesus call the Apostles to follow Him. It's as if the Liturgy of the Word is speaking directly to us...and, you know what? It is!

In the same manner, through His holy word, the Lord Jesus calls each and every one of us into service for the sake of His Kingdom. As we often hear, whether or not that is as dedicated, faithful married folk, a chaste single life, or as priests or religious, *each one of us has been called by Christ!*

There is an age-old axiom in the Church universal: "how we pray shows how we believe," and it rings as true today as it ever has. I truly believe that more and more Catholics throughout the world, are coming to a deeper and clearer understanding of both *What and Who* the Mass is! The more we believe that, as a recent convert to the Catholic Faith put it so very well, "when we enter the doors of the church, it becomes all about HIM; not me; not about my desires, likes or dislikes," then we are grasping the true meaning of the Mass. Remember, we are all still learning!

It may be difficult to believe...but Ash Wednesday, February 17th, is only FOUR weeks away! We should've just left the purple décor in place from Advent! I don't know; but for some reason, I like the start of Lent, it means winter is more than half over, days are growing longer, and the Lenten Season represents the coming glory of Easter. Naturally here at St. Mary, it also means the start up our Lenten Fish Fries! This year they will be drive-through, of course, but will be held each Friday of Lent. Stations will have to be done individually because we cannot distribute and reuse the booklets. Tick-tock...

Next weekend, the 23-24 of January, Masses SHOULD be held as normal! I am expecting to resume daily Mass this coming Tuesday, the 19th. God willing! Gott Bless and Keep Us All!

IMMEDIATE NEEDS: Thin maxi pads, manual can openers, baby wipes; fabric softener/sheets; antibacterial cleaning wipes; general kitchen cleaners; shampoo & conditioner; toilet paper; paper towels; tissues; postage stamps; laundry detergent; paper bowls; toilet cleanser; nonperishable food items – cereal, mac 'n' cheese, peanut butter, jelly, canned pastas, canned fruit, soup; ethnic hair care products; \$10 gas cards (Speedway Gas Only cards are great); bottled water; plastic spoons, forks and knives.

WISH LIST: Laundry detergent, fabric softener/sheets, toilet paper, paper towels, tissues, paper plates, paper bowls, baby wipes, antibacterial cleaning wipes, toilet cleanser, plastic spoons, forks, & knives, nonperishable food items – cereal, mac 'n' cheese, peanut butter, jelly, canned pastas, canned fruit, soup, feminine products, shampoo, conditioner, ethnic hair care products, body wash, lotion, deodorant, razors, shaving cream, bath towels & washcloths, gas cards, stamps, underwear (for adults and children – new), bras – all sizes (gently used is fine), bottled water, coffee and creamer/sugar, snack foods/cereal/fruit, milk and juice, trash bags (39-gallon & 13-gallon bags).

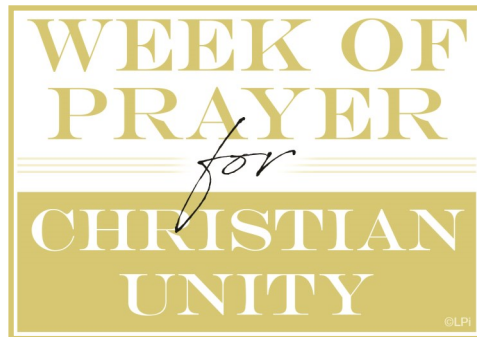

MQP YouTube Channel

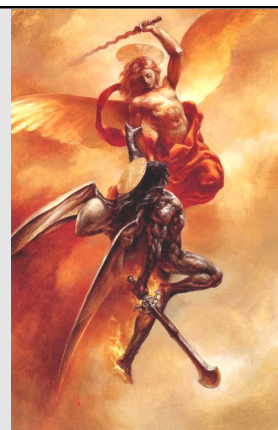
