

"God has found me worthy to be a minister of His Gospel, and so when I speak, I strive to please God and not men." 1 Thessalonians 2:4

+Dear Friends,

"Here am I, Lord; I come to do Your will." This refrain from today's responsorial psalm is a beautiful prayer for all believers as this brief bit of Ordinary Time opens before us.

Today, as baptized and practicing Catholics, how fitting it is that we hear all about being "called." All three readings speak of listening and following the voice of God. We also hear today the Lord Jesus call the Apostles to follow Him. It's as if the Liturgy of the Word is speaking directly to us... and, you know what? It is!

In the same manner, through His holy word, the Lord Jesus calls each and every one of us into service for the sake of His Kingdom. As we often hear, whether that is as dedicated, faithful married folk, a chaste single life, or as priests or religious, each one of us has been called by Christ!

There is an age-old axiom in the Church universal: "how we pray shows how we believe," and it rings as true today as it ever has. I truly believe that more and more Catholics throughout the world are coming to a deeper and clearer understanding of both What and Who the Mass is! The more we believe that, as a recent convert to the Catholic Faith put it so very well, "when we enter the doors of the church, it becomes all about HIM; not me; not about my desires, likes or dislikes," then we are grasping the true meaning of the Mass!

In closing, I would like to mention a Sacrament of the Church. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Even among active, participating Catholics, there is much misunderstanding about this holy Sacrament. The Sacrament is sometimes called "The Last Rites," and that is fine. It is a Sacrament of Healing of mind, soul and body. When facing life-threatening surgery or illness, it is time to "be anointed." If you have a head cold; it is not. Nor should a person wait until they are at "death's door" to be anointed. The Sacrament is NOT magic. If a loved one does not practice the faith nor has expressed a desire to be anointed, it is obvious that they are not interested in the graces of the Sacrament. Grace is not dependent upon our belief, however, the eternal effects of grace does not happen in a vacuum.

For example, look at the Sacrament of Penance. If a person is not contrite nor has the intention of amending their life, the grace of absolution is not received in the soul. One might "fool" the priest...but not God!

May our Lord's richest blessings and grace be upon us!
