Dispensation Lifted & Mask Requirement

Effective June 11, 2021, the dispensation from Sunday and Holy Day Mass ends. As noted through prior letters and notices, exemptions still exist into the future. These are:

• Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease.

• Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issues).

• Those who are homebound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.

• Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.

• Those who are caregivers of persons who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract the virus.

Effective immediately, the wearing of masks is now strongly encouraged but no longer mandatory. If you feel more secure in wearing one, please do so.
