Enter March 2020 and all of that was upended with the Covid pandemic. Talk about uncomfortable?!? While there is movement back to a more normal atmosphere, the dispensation for weekly Mass attendance in person is still in effect (at least for now).

As our MQP family prepares to return to a more normal operation, planning is underway to provide our liturgy at full capacity. That requires assistance from all members of the Mary Queen of Peace family. These past months have relied on a small number of willing volunteers (thank you!) to help in all capacities. Hospitality, Readers, Servers, Eucharistic Ministers and Mass Coordinators. However, it is time to expand that list of willing volunteers. After all, you are already at Mass, why not maximize your time at Mass by providing your talents while you are there. (Part of the time, talent, and treasure mandate.) There is a need in all ministries ... and there is something for everyone.

- Hospitality (Mary O'Brien, chair) - Want to get to know fellow parishioners? This ministry greets people and helps at any of the entrance doors.
- Readers (Bob Freed, chair) - Like to read aloud? Readers proclaim the weekly liturgy at Mass.
- Eucharistic Ministers (Mary Kay Hood, chair) - Feel called to share the Eucharist? Eucharistic Ministers help with the distribution of communion.
- Mass Coordinators (Mary Kay Hood, chair) - Uncomfortable in the spotlight but want to be a part of the liturgy?
- Mass Coordinators prepare the altar for Mass, clean up afterward and put things away once the liturgy is complete.

Feel free to reach out to Mary Kay Hood or any of the ministry chairs if you are interested in participating in the liturgy. There is a mobile app that allows for easy scheduling. Everything is as easy as it can be ... now it's up to you!
