

+Dear Friends,

The first reading sounds like a true prayer of lament that could easily be prayed many times in our lives: "Destruction and violence are before me; there is strife and clamorous discord."

Some folks have said that they no longer care to watch much of the national news anymore. It's filled with war, violence, murder, lack of respect for most human life, and inane 'celebrity' antics. In some ways, you can't blame folks for feeling this way. With the prophet Habakkuk, we can find ourselves crying out: "How long, O Lord?"

In the face of the "clamorous discord" that sometimes fills our lives and hearts, let us not be led into despair, but make the words of the disciples of Jesus our own: "Increase our faith." Sometimes people think that when they question the Lord or seek His peace that it means they don't have sufficient faith. "IF only I could pray harder! IF only I would pray this particular prayer!" I just don't believe that. Rather than show a lack of faith, it shows a great deal of faith to keep praying and seeking.

Look at Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta. The secular media has at times, tried to paint her as someone who lost faith, who didn't believe and was merely going through the motions. How stupid can people be? As the preacher to the Vatican household commented, she lived a life of true martyrdom. Hours spent in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament while hearing virtually nothing. THAT IS FAITH AND HOPE! To accomplish the works of charity she did, trusting in Jesus' will, is the mark of true sainthood, not foolishness or the mark of someone who is merely 'going through the motions.'

The prophet Habakkuk, the disciples of Jesus and Blessed Teresa of Calcutta welcome us into their company. It's normal to sometimes feel like a great Saint when she said to Jesus: "If this is the way You treat Your friends, it's no wonder You have so few!" We've all been there. Remember the words of Jesus today; at times, the only faith we can manifest is the "size of a mustard seed." And that's OK. Welcome to the Communion of the Saints!

Let's not forget our FALL FISH FRYS WILL BE HELD ON FRIDAY, OCTOBER 14TH AND OCTOBER 21ST!! We were very successful last year tying into the traffic coming through from the Covered Bridge Festival in Parke County. I think we shall be once again this year!
