

#### +Dear Friends,

As we gather to celebrate Mass this weekend, we are continuing our journey into the land of parables.

Today we hear three parables about the kingdom of heaven. The passage ends with those same words as last Sunday's: "Whoever has ears ought to hear." The meaning of Jesus' parables is often difficult to grasp. This is why the disciples repeatedly ask Jesus for a little help; a little clarification if you would be so kind!

I suppose we are not that different from the chosen Apostles, are we? All of us need a little help in not only understanding the parables but in living them. It's one thing to hear them; it's quite another to put them into practice!

You know, that's why we have the Mass. That's why we have confession. That's why we have the catechism. All lead and guide us in the ways and truth of Jesus Christ! Jesus did not leave us orphans. He established His Church, with His Vicar, the Holy Father, to lead and guide us. Thank God for that! One need only look about at the various factions, all proclaiming to possess the truth; the fullness of Christ's presence and teaching and recognize the pandemonium which exists without the Vicar of Christ to guide us! Whenever a nation or people choose, not according to Jesus Christ, but rather opinion or polls, they are in trouble. Our nation stands at a pivotal point in our history. We can choose justice and peace, or we can choose chaos and anarchy. I think one would have to have their head in the sand if they did not believe that there exists forces from within and outside, that want to force an agenda on our nation. In reality, they wish to alter our society to something we have never been, nor should we be. I agree with St. Paul; we are dealing with and facing a spiritual battle; a spiritual warfare. Evil is at work. This is not just the work of man. This is not "gloom and doom." Again, it is reality; it is what it is. Now more than ever, we need prayer and recourse to Jesus Christ and His vehicles of grace and strength ... the seven Sacraments.
