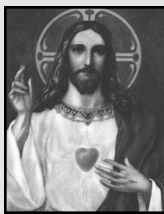

We have begun. Schools are open once again; we pray for good! Each in our own way we need to keep our kids in our prayers, as well as teachers and parents, that all goes well in these uncertain days. If you have not picked up a registration packet for this year's RE classes, please do so! They are in the narthex by the current entrance/exit.

"O woman, great is your faith." Addressed to the persistent (some would say pushy!) Canaanite woman in today's Gospel, these words most certainly resonate within our own hearts.

Many of us know people, and perhaps even ourselves at times, for whom these words of the Lord are fitting and right. We think of parents whose faith in the face of sadness and loss is more than inspiring. We think of people whose simple and yet very profound faith has truly been an inspiration for us.

We need only look around us at Mass today to realize that the great gift of faith of so many people is a central pillar upon which the Church of Jesus continues to be built.

Persistence in prayer is a hallmark of the mature Christian. To be persistent in prayer, to keep right in there asking the Lord for His grace and favor, is a sign of great faith! I strongly believe that to be so. One thing we are not good at ... specificity in prayer. In other words, we need to pray for what the Church teaches as ACTUAL GRACE. Actual Grace is a grace we need from God for specific healing or struggles. At times some feel a general prayer covers it all, which it does, however, as a priest once told me, "We need to demonstrate to the Lord our awareness that for this or that particular circumstance, we ourselves recognize our special need for grace; not tomorrow or next week, but at the present moment." Try that approach, I believe it will make a difference in our prayer life. Let us today pray for this gift of God ... persistence and trust in prayer. And let us pray for one another also!

My friends, there is absolutely *nothing* of more importance that *our parish does than the offering of Holy Mass*. Now I realize it is not always possible to be at daily Mass; there are times, as you all well know, when I am away or have to cancel a Mass during the week.

However, *no parish* grows and flourishes without a thriving, strong devotion to Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament and the celebration of the Mass!
