

In today's first reading we hear the story of the people of Nineveh, who repented of their sinful ways and offer a shining example of our Father's divine mercy and forgiveness.

Our Lord Jesus calls us to repent and believe in the Gospel. It is note-worthy that our Lord's call to follow Him is issued within the context of repentance. Sometimes, we don't make the connection in our own lives. Following Jesus entails conversion and repentance; it must always do so in order to be authentic and graced.

When we forget this connection, we are actually attempting to follow Jesus on our terms, not His. It's as if we say to the Lord, "I will follow You, Lord, BUT allow me to bring this old habit, sin or attitude along with me." Well, sooner or later we learn that we can't have it OUR way. We need to always remember, we are members of the ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH. Therefore, there are many aspects of our faith life that are simply bigger than we are! We are not St. Mary, Queen of Peace Catholic Church alone....we belong to the Church Universal as well as the Archdiocese of Indianapolis. We are not a community that can "pick and choose" what we believe or profess or do. Our freedom and unity are ours precisely because we belong to the Church! 
