Today the Church celebrates **Laetare Sunday**. Taken from the Latin for "rejoice", we today hear of rejoicing in the readings. The Church points out to us, while in the midst of Lenten prayer, fasting and charity, that the glory and joy of Easter are approaching! The solemn violet of the vestments is set aside and the rose vestment is worn. Mixing the violet with the glorious white of Easter, we have rose. And so, let us rejoice in our hearts!

We hear on this Laetare Sunday of the greatest mercy shown us by God our Father: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son." We gaze upon the Son, "lifted up" for our salvation. We look upon Him "Whom they have pierced." We behold the Son of God, the source of everlasting life! What perfect thoughts for a rejoicing Sunday! And, it is important for us to remember, that it is not merely by LOOKING upon Jesus that we may gain salvation. We must LIVE Jesus, the One Who pierced for our offenses!

Lenten Disciplines



Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent.

Fasting is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

By the threefold discipline of fasting, almsgiving and prayer, the Church keeps Lent from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday, which is on March 28.
