

+Dear Friends,

Today's readings are ones of reassurance and hope. When we hear words such as "love" and "joy" used over and over again in a set of readings, it is a signal for us simply to thank God for the incredible gift given to this world in and through the Person of Jesus Christ.

Here, in His Eucharistic Heart, and only here, can we find the kind of hope and joy that will never desert us or run dry. Here, and only here, can we find the grace that can pull us out of even the deepest despair.

As one departs from Mass today, let us be filled with thanksgiving for the priceless Gift that comes to us through, with and in Christ Jesus!

"Father, what about the Holy Day of the **ASCEN-SION**? Is it this Thursday or what?" Well, in answer to that question, remember that the bishops of the United States, with the exception of one or two dioceses, moved the celebration of the ASCENSION to the Seventh Sunday of Easter some years ago. This means that the annual celebration of the ASCENSION will be on that weekend from now on! So, if anyone asks you the question, now you know the answer! ASCENSION will be next weekend....May 11-12!

I wish to briefly share the results of our recent survey concerning the proposed Parish Life Center addition that was originally to be a part of the building campaign for the Narthex, Offices and Classrooms. Our parish consists of approximately 470 households. Constituting those are roughly 966 people. Of that number, in our survey, we had a participation total of 15%. Of those participating the majority, around 80%, favored moving forward with the final component of the original plan, the Parish Life Center.

It goes without saying that the level of interest and/or participation was extremely low. It could be assumed that those choosing not to participate in the survey by submitting a completed survey did so from a standpoint of a low interest level; for an unknown myriad of reasons.

While that was and is the case, the Pastoral Council and myself deem it very important to continue the momentum shown by our parish in the successful building campaign, as well as the roof replacement for the church which took place last summer.

With that in mind, here are a few thoughts: First, I encourage everyone to include the parish and our growth in your prayers. As Danville grows, so will St. Mary's. Secondly, I encourage everyone to include our parish in your wills in the future. Thirdly, I encourage everyone to prayerfully continue using the Gold Envelope in your monthly contribution packets. These funds are set aside for major parish building and maintenance needs as well as the setting aside of funds for future expansion.

In other words, as we built the Gold Envelope Fund higher last year, we were able to complete the new roof for the church with no loan from the Archdiocese. In the same manner, as we build the Gold Envelope Fund, portions will be set aside and banked, earmarked for the Life Center.

I am calling this endeavor our "LEGACY." We build for the future of our parish. Our "LEGACY" to our children continues!
