A Journey of Faith

The Process

The OCIA process forms participants in the Catholic faith and practices through worship, ritual celebrations, prayer, scripture, discussion, and learning sessions on Catholic beliefs and teaching.



The Sacraments

Those not yet baptized are initiated into the Catholic Church through the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil (the night before Easter).

Those who are baptized will also receive the Sacraments of Eucharist, Reconciliation, and Confirmation.
