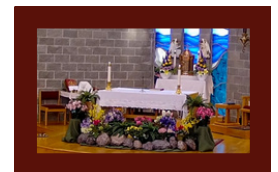
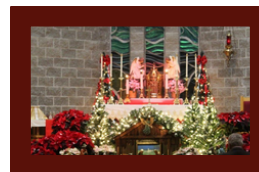
Christ is the heart of Cor.
