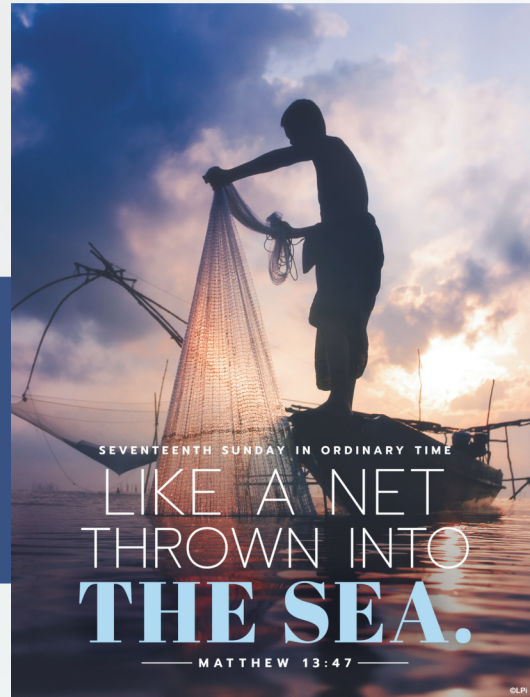

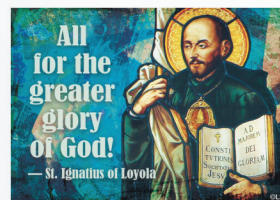

Why Do Catholics Request Mass Intentions?



One of the beautiful traditions of our Catholic faith is the opportunity to have a Mass offered for a particular intention. Many people request a Mass for a loved one who has died, someone who is ill, a special anniversary, in thanksgiving for blessings received, or for any personal intention.

The reason is simple: the Holy Mass is the greatest prayer of the Church. At every Mass, we participate in the one perfect sacrifice of Jesus Christ, made present sacramentally on the altar. While every Mass is celebrated for the good of the entire Church and the salvation of the world, the priest may also offer the Mass for a specific intention.

When we request a Mass intention, we ask God to pour out the abundant graces of Christ's sacrifice upon a particular person or need. For those who have died, it is a loving act of remembrance and prayer, entrusting them to God's infinite mercy. For the living, it is a powerful way to seek God's guidance, healing, strength, comfort, and blessings.

Many people wonder about the customary offering that accompanies a Mass intention. This is not a payment for the Mass or for God's grace, which can never be bought or sold. Rather, it is a voluntary offering that supports the mission and ministry of the Church while expressing our own participation in the Eucharistic sacrifice. At Mary Queen of Peace, the suggested donation for a Mass intention is \$10.

To help ensure that as many parishioners as possible have the opportunity to request a Mass intention, we observe the following guidelines:

- Only one Mass intention may be scheduled for each Mass.
- Mass intentions may be scheduled up to one calendar year in advance from the current date.
- In accordance with the Church's tradition and law, one Mass every Sunday is offered for the People of Mary Queen of Peace Parish (Pro Populo) and is therefore not available for other intentions.

Requesting a Mass intention is a meaningful way to remember loved ones, celebrate important milestones, seek God's help during difficult times, or simply give thanks for His many blessings. It is a beautiful expression of faith and a reminder that, as members of the Body of Christ, we are called to pray for one another.

If you would like to request a Mass intention, please contact the parish office. It is a privilege for our parish community to join you in lifting your intentions to God through the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
