There are several good reasons a Catholic family might choose Religious Education (RE) for their children. The biggest benefit is that it helps form the whole person—not just teach facts about Catholicism.

1. It gives children a foundation in the Catholic faith
 - Religious Education can help children understand:
 - Who God is and what the Church teaches
 - Scripture and the life of Jesus
 - The Mass and the sacraments
 - Catholic prayers and traditions
 - Why Catholics believe what they believe
 - How faith connects to everyday decisions
 - This is especially valuable because children naturally ask deeper questions as they grow.
2. It helps parents fulfill their role as the primary educators of their children in faith
 - Catholic education isn't meant to replace parents. Ideally, Religious Education supports what you're already trying to teach at home. It gives parents resources, language, and a community to help pass the faith on to their children.
3. Faith becomes more than something they do on Sundays
 - Religious Education will help children see that Catholicism isn't simply a class or a set of rules. It will help them understand how their faith affects:
 - How they treat other people
 - How they handle difficult situations
 - How they understand right and wrong
 - How they pray
 - How they respond to suffering
 - What kind of person they want to become
4. They develop relationships with other Catholic children
 - This can be particularly important as children get older. Having friends who share their faith can make it easier for them to remain connected to the Church rather than feeling that Catholicism is something only their parents care about.
5. It prepares them for the sacraments
 - Depending on the program and your child's age, Religious Education may provide preparation for First Reconciliation, First Communion, and Confirmation. More importantly, ideally it helps children understand why those sacraments matter rather than simply preparing them to complete them.
6. It gives them a place to ask difficult questions
 - Children shouldn't have to be afraid to ask things like, "Why does the Church teach that?" or "How do we know God exists?" The Mary Queen of Peace Religious Education program will give them an environment where they can ask those questions honestly and learn how to think about their faith.
7. It can help preserve their faith into adulthood
 - One of the strongest reasons to start young is that religious formation is cumulative. You're giving them a foundation they can draw upon later when they encounter doubt, different worldviews, suffering, college life, or other challenges to their beliefs.

And perhaps the simplest reason is this: if you believe the Catholic faith is true and that knowing and loving God is important, then giving your children a structured opportunity to know that faith is a natural part of raising them in it.
